# PREFACE

## THE KENYA WE DESIRE

**D**esire is a powerful force that shapes much of our actions, thoughts, and, ultimately, our lives. In both secular and religious contexts, desire plays a fundamental role in determining the direction of our choices.

Secular society often defines desire as a craving for material success, personal pleasure, or fulfilling individual wants. It drives people to achieve, to acquire, and to pursue satisfaction. From a religious standpoint, however, desire takes on a deeper, more spiritual meaning. For Christians, desire is not merely about fulfilling personal needs but is a longing for God's will to be done on earth as it is in heaven. It desires holiness, righteousness, and living according to God's divine plan. As Micah 6:8 reminds us, "He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." Desire, when aligned with justice, mercy, and humility, leads us toward God's will. When misaligned, however, desire can drive us toward selfishness and sin. Christian desire is outward-facing, driven by love for God and neighbour, seeking the common good.

Biblically, desire is complex. The Scriptures speak of desire in many forms: as a natural impulse, a source of temptation, and a force that can lead to righteousness or sin. In Genesis 3:6, desire is seen in its first appearance when Eve looks upon the fruit and desires it for the knowledge it promises. This is a desire that ultimately leads to the fall of humanity. On the other hand, the Bible also presents desire as something holy and noble, as in Psalm 37:4, where the righteous are promised that God will give them the desires of their hearts when they delight in Him. Desire, then, can lead us toward God or away from Him, depending on how it is nurtured and directed.

As we prepare for the 2025 Lenten Campaign in Kenya, the theme **The Kenya We Desire** resonates with us as Christians living in this great land. The Kenya we desire is not one of division, corruption, or despair but one where justice, peace, and unity reign; where all citizens, especially the marginalised, can thrive, where leadership is marked by integrity, and each person desires the welfare of others.

During this Lenten season, we are invited to reflect deeply on our desires for our country and ask ourselves whether those desires align with the values of the Kingdom of God.

This is about desiring transformation that starts in our hearts and radiates into the fabric of our society. Lent invites all of us to examine our desires and to purify them. In the context of Kenya's challenges – political instability, economic hardship, or social injustice – we are called to desire what is good for the country, pray for healing and unity, and commit ourselves to actions that reflect these desires. The Christian call is not just to pray for Kenya but to actively seek the welfare of our nation in every sphere of life. As citizens, we must be willing to work towards a nation that reflects the justice and peace that Christ desires for all His people.

Even in the face of difficult decisions, where the right course of action is not always clear, we must turn to St Thomas Aquinas' *Doctrine of Double Effect* for guidance. He teaches that when we face situations where our actions will have both good and bad consequences, we must carefully examine our intentions. If our desire is genuinely for good, and the bad effect is unintended and proportionate, then our action may still be morally justifiable. For instance, in seeking justice, we may face situations where enforcing the law may inadvertently harm someone. In such cases, our intent to protect the common good must guide us. St Thomas reminds us that our intentions must always align with the higher moral responsibilities to act justly, with wisdom, and according to God's will.

The five-week Lenten season presents **The Kenya We Desire** through five thematic areas that will help shape our desires for our country. In the **first week**, we reflect on **family unity and its role in building a peaceful society**. The family is the first institution where values are instilled, and a united family builds a united nation. **Week 2** focuses on **corruption and the need for accountability**. The desire for a corrupt-free Kenya must become a deep aspiration for each of us. **Week 3** invites us to reflect on **the youth and their potential as the untapped resource of our nation**. **Week 4** turns our attention to the importance of **holistic education**, where the desire for a system that nurtures our young people's intellect and character is paramount. Finally, **Week 5** focuses on **caring for our common home**, urging us to reflect on how our desire for environmental stewardship can restore and protect God's creation for future generations.

Each week's message challenges us as individuals and as a society. As we

reflect on **The Kenya We Desire**, we are called to consider not only what we want for ourselves but also what we want for others. We are called to desire the good of all people, regardless of their background or status.

As Christians, we cannot be content with mere individual blessings while others suffer. The collective good is our responsibility, and we must desire a society that fosters equality, justice, and compassion.

The challenge is not just about a spiritual desire for transformation but a practical commitment to action. As Kenyan citizens, we have a role in creating the desired country. In the workplace, politics, community, and homes, we must embody the virtues of integrity, love, and justice. The Gospel challenges us to be salt and light in the world, and in the same way, we are called to be agents of change for the betterment of Kenya.

As we journey through this Lenten season, let us reflect on the words of the good thief crucified alongside Jesus. He cried out: "Remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). Just as he desired to be remembered and redeemed, so must we purify our desires, ensuring that they are aligned with those of God's Kingdom, seeking the good of all, especially the marginalised, the oppressed, and those without a voice.

Finally, let us turn to Mother Mary, who embodied the perfect example of the desire for God's will. As the "handmaid of the Lord," she desired to do God's will. Let her prayers for us, her children, guide our desires and lead us toward a prosperous, just, and compassionate Kenya. May we, through her intercession, understand fully God's desires for our country and work together to see them fulfilled. Amen.

# INTRODUCTION

## LENT IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

**I**n the Christian tradition, this is the period in the liturgical calendar from Ash Wednesday to Palm Sunday (Sundown). This annual commemoration prepares the faithful through prayer, repentance, giving alms and self-denial. The event is linked to the Passion of Christ and the celebration of his Resurrection. It is also in this liturgical period that catechumens are baptised on Easter.

### Why 40 Days?

The number 40 is important in the life of Christians. Moses and the Israelites, for example, wandered in the desert for 40 years as they prepared to go to the Promised Land. Moses was on Mount Sinai for 40 days and 40 nights without eating or drinking water, where he had gone to receive the tablets of the Covenant God made with the Israelites. In the time of Noah, it rained for 40 days and 40 nights. Elijah spent 40 days and 40 nights on Mount Horeb without food. In the New Testament, Jesus was led to the wilderness where he fasted for 40 days and 40 nights.

### Why the Kenya Lenten Campaign?

In the spiritual mood of Lent, the Catholic Church in Kenya felt the need to inform the public of the problems affecting society and advocate for change. Through the Lenten Campaign, the Kenya Conference of Catholic Bishops call for all Christians and people of goodwill to join them in addressing these problems and advocate for change. By joining the bishops in advocacy, individual efforts, our small voices become much louder and each individual's action is multiplied.

# PREAMBLE

## STATIONS OF THE CROSS

### **STATION 1: Jesus is condemned to death**

As we view the scene, we look at Jesus; His face, the crown of thorns, the blood and hands tied behind His back. His clothes are stuck to the wounds. Herod washes his hands off the whole unjust affair. We too act in the same manner. We tie others with our views and subject them to indignity using power that is meant to empower and not subject people to slavery. We pray that those in authority may enable us to be free from things that tie our hands over decisions meant to improve our lives.

### **STATION 2: Jesus carries His Cross**

We contemplate on the weight of the cross and how uncomfortable is on His shoulders, having been unfairly judged. How often do we place heavy loads on our dear ones with actions which cause discomfort such as pollution, exploitation of natural resources, littering and destruction of sources of clean and safe drinking water? Let us pray that we may be good stewards of the resources entrusted to us by God for the common good.

### **STATION 3: Jesus falls for the first time**

We stare at weakness in his eyes, his whole body exhausted and on the ground, being roughed up by soldiers as they pull up. We too, find ourselves in similar life circumstances. There are forces that pull us down to our knees such as the high cost of living challenges that demotivate us and make life unbearable to a point of losing hope. Jesus gives us the strength to look at our situation with hope. Let us pray that those who have may help the poor and those in authority move to check the cost of living weighing heavily on the poor.

### **STATION 4: Jesus meets His Mother**

As we watch them, we contemplate the mystery of love's power to give strength and overcome life's tragedies, violence, hatred, disunity and hopelessness. How often do we show love to others at their lowest moments, when rejected, misunderstood, misjudged and labelled as evil; or those from families with members practicing extremism to the detriment of others? We pray that we shun discrimination based on religion; that having been created in the image and likeness of God, we should desist from vices such as human trafficking, organ harvesting, cultism and extremism. We pray that we all see and love each other through embracing and guarding the sanctity of life.

### **STATION 5: Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus to carry His Cross**

We look at His sorrowful gaze, pleading for help, as we contemplate his struggle. It's important we see how he looks at Simon with utmost humility and gratitude. Jesus reminds us that there is a time when we need the unquestioning help of

others. We are being challenged to get into the lives of those struggling to make ends meet, the ones whose families are facing threats of breaking up, and the dehumanised. We are called to uphold solidarity and appreciate the power in unity for the good of all with no families, drug addicts or those engaging in prostitution and other social evils that afflict families.

### **STATION 6: Veronica wipes the face of Jesus**

As we look at the face of Jesus, what do we see? What does it hold for us? What do we see as we look deeply into the agony and pain of others? Can we embrace those in similar problems? With their faces all covered with their impetuous passion?

### **STATION 7: Jesus falls for the second time**

We look thoughtfully at Jesus on the ground, with all the agony taking its toll on him. We let our heart go out to him knowing that we will never feel alone in our suffering. Let us ask him for forgiveness for not relying on him. Lord, give us courage to lift our spirit once we fall into anxiety, depression, burnout, mental imbalances and illnesses that wear us out. May we look upon you as a source of inspiration to become what you meant us to be.

### **STATION 8: Jesus meets the woman of Jerusalem**

We look at their faces, so full of love and gratitude, loss and fear. We wonder what words might have passed between them. His tender, compassionate and merciful love for us places us with the women and children in his support. Lord, the women of Jerusalem remind us that those who suffer have dignity and are your children. We pray that we may restore the value of the human personality above idols of production, technology, the state, race, nationality and all other actions that disfigure our world.

### **STATION 9: Jesus falls for the third time**

We pause to contemplate him on the ground; the brokenness that makes us whole, the surrender that gives us life. We pause to experience and receive His complete love for us. He is indeed completely poured out for us. Lord, you challenge us to follow your directions of compassion, kindness and love. More often we move away from these. We ask you to be our way so that we may keep our vision fixed on you as the source of our strength in our problems and sufferings.

### **STATION 10: Jesus' clothes are taken away**

We pause to watch Him stripped down and how he faces his death with such nakedness. We reflect on how much of himself he has revealed to us, holding nothing back. Lord, you invite us to lay out ourselves before you to acquire our original innocence. We have clothed ourselves with pride, disobedience, exploitation and evils that have made the life of others unbearable. Create for us a society that pleases you and is fast in service, solidarity and worship.

### **STATION 11: Jesus is nailed to the Cross**

We make ourselves watch the nails being driven through his flesh. As we watch his face, can there be any pain or agony he would not understand? Lord, we too nail our brothers and sisters. We fail to forgive them, help or share with them to create a community of love. Our hearts are full of hatred and a spirit of revenge. Help us to cast them all out through forgiveness, for it is in forgiving that we are forgiven.

### **STATION 12: Jesus dies on the Cross**

We stand there at the foot of the Cross and behold our salvation. There, we experience the giver of life transit from life to death. Lord, we experience little deaths through hurts, broken families, conflicts and misunderstandings. In every one of us, there is a wound inflicted by failure, humiliations and bad conscience. Through your death, let us be transfigured by you to change them into a focus of energy, source of creativity where communion, friendship and understanding burst forth.

### **STATION 13: Jesus is taken down from the Cross**

We behold this scene at the foot of the Cross. We deeply think of touching and caressing his body. We remember all that his hands have touched, all who have been blessed by his warm embrace and pause to let it soak in. He knows the mystery of death. He has fallen into good hands. You have been wounded to death. Lord, we echo the words of your servant Job, that I know my redeemer lives, and that at the last we will stand upon the earth then in my flesh I shall see God ... (Job 19:25-27). Forgive us for so often we live only for ourselves; our lives revolve around our little work of what we want and what we fear. Grow in us a spiritually attentive, larger and more generous heart. Help us to redirect ourselves and our concerns outwardly towards your spirit, who dwells on the people around us.

### **STATION 14: Jesus is laid in the tomb**

We stand for a moment outside His tomb. This final journey of His life has shown us the meaning of his gift of himself to us. This tomb represents every tomb we stand before with fear, in defeat, struggling to believe it could even be empty. Lord, you taught that eternal life is to know God and Jesus whom He has sent. A life of commitment, trust and love. Especially our commitment to the human life of all, particularly the most deprived in our final dying. Let us seek to communicate this sense of eternal life, this love and trust, which helps us to overcome the fears of those about them. Let our dying moment be an act of trust in God to overcome the fears of death.

**All: Because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world.**







## WEEK ONE

# FAMILY: FOUNDATION OF OUR CHURCH AND SOCIETY

### SEE: STORY

**F**araja and Fahari lived happily in Chang'omba village with their two children, Amani and Jasiri. Faraja, a thriving businesswoman, and her husband, Fahari, who had recently been retrenched, shared their joys and sorrows. Beneath the facade of family bliss, a storm brewed, fuelled by societal pressures and personal insecurities. Haunted by the constant belittlement from his peers for depending on his wife for a living, Fahari struggled with feelings of inadequacy, which affected his self-worth and family harmony.

Their daughter Amani, caught in the growing rift between her parents, sought comfort in the company of new friends who affirmed and gave her a sense of belonging. She fell prey to drugs and substance abuse, dropped out of school and was reduced to a shell of her old self.

Initially, Jasiri had delinked from his family's issues by immersing himself in his academic and extra-curricular activities. However, the situation changed when Fahari physically assaulted Faraja, resulting in her hospitalisation. Disturbed by the sad situation in the family, Jasiri vowed to find a solution. He sought the intervention of Church elders who reconciled the parents, reminding them of the importance of unity, respect, and harmony in the family as the foundation of society. Fahari promised to work on his insecurities and accept that either party could be the family's breadwinner. They apologised to their children and committed to being good role models. They regretted the damage caused to their children, especially Amani, whom they enrolled in a rehabilitation centre.

### JUDGE: SITUATION ANALYSIS

Article 45(1) of the Constitution of Kenya recognises that the family is the natural and fundamental unit of society and the necessary basis of social order. Pope Francis has frequently emphasised the importance of family as the cornerstone of society. He advocates for mutual respect and support within the family unit, highlighting the role of love and understanding in overcoming personal and societal challenges. His call resonates deeply with the decision by Fahari and Faraja to reconcile through compassion and respect. Article 27(1) of the Constitution

emphasises that every person is equal before the law and has the right to equal protection and benefit from the law. These constitutional principles highlight the importance of equality and protection of the family unit, which directly relates to Faraja's plight.

Faraja's hospitalisation after the brawl with her husband highlights the severity of domestic violence in families. The African traditional beliefs often emphasise the importance of community and the family in maintaining social order and harmony. African traditional societies, emphasised that the family is the source of strength and a unifying factor. However, their adherence to outdated notions of masculinity and femininity reveals the need to work towards promoting gender equality and cohesion in the family.

The Catholic Social Teaching emphasises the critical role of the family as the fundamental unit of society, promoting values of peace, justice, and dignity. The call to family aligns with this teaching, recognising it as the primary environment for nurturing values and virtues. It also stresses the dignity of the human person and the sanctity of life. The Church, therefore, condemns violence against the human person, underscoring the equality of men and women in dignity, the need to create a safe and supportive environment for all family members, and calling for an end to the culture of moral decay that perpetuates such atrocities.

## **SPIRITUAL REFLECTION**

**Deuteronomy 26:4-10**

**Romans 10:8-13**

**Luke 4:1-13**

We believe in a God who liberates us, leading us through the desert of our lives to the prosperity that He desires for us. Our faith is centred on the liberating work realised for our benefit. His love for us is so deep that He was willing to experience our weaknesses and pain to meet us in our life situation, console us in the midst of whatever we are going through, and gently lift us out of it to the new life He has in store for us.

The Holy Spirit led Jesus into the desert, where He was tempted. In Jesus, these temptations reveal the nature of the spiritual battle inside us and the power of faith in overcoming them. In facing and overcoming the temptation of physical hunger (turning stones into bread), Jesus shows that our sustenance comes from our relationship with God, not material possessions. What sustains and keeps the family strong is not in satisfying bodily or material needs but in a strong and deep relationship with God. In facing and overcoming the temptation to prove His divine powers by

performing a miraculous act to benefit Himself and to test God (throwing Himself off the Temple), Jesus emphasises that God's protection is based on trusting in His will. The family is best protected when it remains faithful to God's will. In facing and overcoming the temptation of seeking worldly power and glory in return for worshipping Satan, Jesus steadfastly refuses by declaring that we worship and serve God alone. We should never choose the passing kingdom of this world in place of the eternal kingdom of God.

Satan tempts the family to stray from God's path. However, just as Jesus showed us, our unwavering faith in God will enable us to resist temptation. The family has to rely on the Scriptures for guidance and strength in facing temptations. By understanding the temptations of Jesus, we can better comprehend our struggles with sin and learn how to overcome them through faith and reliance on God.

So, whether the "desert" of your family is only a slight agitation in life right now or a struggle against complete despair, Jesus wants to meet you and bring you out. He conquered the desert once and for all, and He can conquer any desert in your family life, too.

## WEEK TWO CORRUPTION

### SEE: STORY

**T**ikiti was a respected village elder within Parachichi Constituency. He was a man of the people who helped his community in development projects. He held various leadership positions in the community and the Church. During the general elections, he vied for Member of Parliament (MP) and made myriad promises on how he would uplift the lives and welfare of his constituency. People unanimously elected him because of the trust.

A few months after the elections, Tikiti's started showing arrogance, irritability, and impatience towards his constituents. He stopped participating in community activities, diverted community resources to personal use, acquired a fleet of vehicles, and moved his family to the city. He influenced the appointment of his eldest son, Wadonjo, as head of the local development fund's procurement committee. Wadonjo used the opportunity to misappropriate funds meant for bursaries and the construction of roads, schools, and hospitals. He acquired land in a leafy city suburb and built several apartments.

Tikiti chaired the parliamentary budget committee, which proposed punitive taxes that would raise the cost of living. The team also introduced new levies that would promote the extravagant and wasteful lifestyles of MPs. The committee invited views from the public over the proposed taxation measures, which were, unfortunately, ignored, and the budget passed without any amendments.

The people of Parachichi petitioned the anti-corruption office to investigate the misuse of their constituency funds and moved to recall their MP. Tikiti and his son were convicted and jailed for economic crimes. The state froze their accounts and confiscated their properties.

### JUDGE: SITUATION ANALYSIS

Corruption is the abuse of entrusted power for private gain. It can be classified as petty, grand, or systemic depending on the amount of money lost and the sector in which it occurs. Corruption erodes the fabric of society, undermines people's trust in political and economic systems, institutions, and leaders, and it can cost people their freedom, health, money, and loss of life. Corruption leads to a decline in the quality of



goods and services, as resources are diverted to personal use rather than invested in public welfare. Obtaining goods and services becomes more expensive and time-consuming, disadvantaging those without the means to bribe their way through bureaucratic hurdles. Moreover, corruption undermines fairness and equal access to opportunities, perpetuating social divisions and exacerbating ethnic and religious tensions. It also weakens democracy by eroding public trust in institutions and undermines the rule of law. It hampers economic development by diverting resources away from productive investments and fostering an environment of crony capitalism, inequality, and poverty.

The 2023 Transparency International Corruption Perception Index listed Kenya as the 126th least corrupt nation out of 180 countries. Chapter 6 of the Constitution provides for leadership and integrity and further establishes key institutions to deal with corruption in the country. However, these have done little to stem Kenya's long history of dubious contracts and scandals. After independence, land grabbing and doubtful procurement deals were among the first signs of how contracts could be manipulated for personal gain. No government has escaped a maize scandal since 1963. In 1965, Kenya exported 250,000 bags of maize to Japan only to be forced to import thousands of tonnes of yellow maize from the US. Between 2008 and 2009, a maize imports scandal hit Kenyans. There was the KenRen fertiliser scandal in the 1970s which cost Kenyans Kshs2.4 billion in 2003. The 1980s and 1990s witnessed the Goldenberg deal that led to the loss of over US\$1.5 billion, equivalent to 10 per cent of the GDP. There was Turkwell Hydroelectric Power Station project, initiated in 1986, whose cost ballooned to \$450 million, double its initial estimate, and produced much less electricity than projected. The Anglo-Leasing scandal in early 2000 cost Kenyans about \$33 million. The Triton petroleum scandal left banks with losses amounting to over \$100 million.

In education, millions of funds meant for the Free Primary Education (FPE) programme were embezzled by education officials, leading to an international outcry. In 2014, Kenya raised \$2.75 billion through a Eurobond (international bond) issuance. However, it is alleged that a large portion of the money could not be accounted for. In 2015, Kshs791 million (\$7.9 million) was allegedly stolen from the National Youth Service through fictitious contracts. In 2018, the NYS lost Kshs9 billion allegedly siphoned off through fraudulent procurement deals. Around the same time, KSh5 billion from the Ministry of Health meant for hospitals, medicines, and health infrastructure was allegedly stolen through irregular procurement deals and manipulation of accounting systems. The ambitious Galana-Kulalu Irrigation Project aimed to address food insecurity by irrigating one million acres of arid land gobbled up Kshs7.3 billion (\$70 million)

but failed to produce the expected results. Investigations revealed gross mismanagement, inflated costs, and contract irregularities. There was the scandal of the Aror and Kimwarer dams which were never built but the contracted Italian company was allegedly paid Kshs63b. The Adani-JKIA deal, was recently cancelled following public uproar over its suspected fraudulent contract. A similar JKIA expansion deal in 2010 saw Kshs10b compensated for “anticipated losses” without delivering results.

During his visit to Kenya in 2015, Pope Francis challenged Kenyans to shun corruption. Addressing Kenyan youth, the Pope asserted that: “Corruption is not a path to life, but a path to death. Each time we accept a bribe and we put it in our pockets, we destroy our hearts. We destroy our personalities and we destroy our country. Please don’t develop that taste for that sugar which is called corruption.”

In his encyclical *Evangelii Gaudium* Pope Francis also highlights the corrosive effects of corruption on society, stating that “Corruption is a cancer at the heart of society that eats away at a nation’s moral fibre.” He urges all people of faith to resist the temptation of corruption and strive for a just society.

Subsequently, on October 5, 2019, the Kenya Conference of Catholic Bishops launched an anti-corruption campaign, *Let us break the chain of corruption*, and led thousands of the Catholic faithful in making a personal commitment against corruption.

Public participation is a value in the Constitution and a principle in governance that needs to take root. Funds should be collected and spent according to community needs and priorities. Further, the public must monitor the use of funds to establish quality.

There is a need to deal decisively with corruption and fully implement the anti-graft laws. Kenyans should speak in one voice and demand accountability for the country’s resources. This can only be achieved through active public participation and respect for the rule of law.

## **SPIRITUAL REFLECTION**

Abraham trusted in God’s promises even when humanly speaking they seemed unattainable. His integrity, trust, and humble submission pleased God. A person with such qualities cannot be corrupt because they feel answerable to God. We fall into corruption when we fail to place

our concerns in God's hands. To avoid the corruption trap, we need to put passing things in their place, not placing our value on them, as St. Paul tells us in the second reading, and not letting them enslave us. Our goal should be on our true value, which lies not within the material and human realm but in the spiritual and divine order of things.

In the Gospel, Jesus took Peter, James, and John up the mountain to experience His glory. The climb towards God's glory may be hard but worth enduring. We reflect today, at the beginning of Lent, on the glory of God that makes the crosses we endure all worth it. It is worth living a life of integrity, however difficult it is, because the challenges cannot be compared with the graces we shall receive on earth and the glory promised to us in heaven. Strive to make the experience of Peter, James, and John your own, be consoled by God's glory, and never forget that this is the ultimate promise He gives to all who press on. Do not settle for anything less.

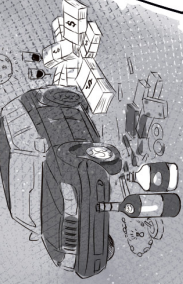

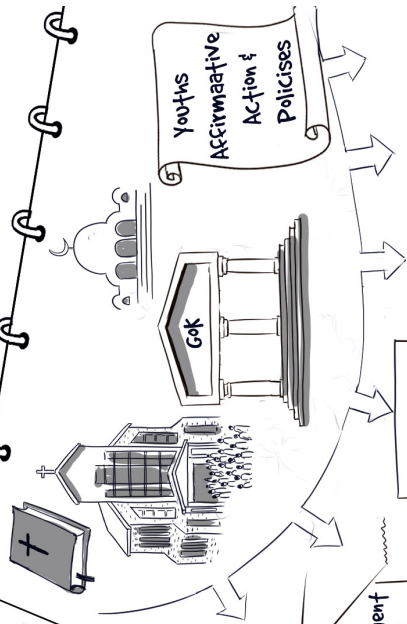

## WEEK THREE

# YOUTH: THE UNTAPPED RESOURCE

### SEE: STORY

**S**hupavu was born a jovial child in Tayari village. He had loving parents and spent most of his childhood grazing his father's cattle and swimming in the local stream whenever he was not in school. He loved attending Mass at his local Church and was nicknamed "Bishop" due to his long service as an altar boy.

Upon finishing high school, Shupavu was admitted to one of the best universities in the city to study Computer Science. In high hopes and full of dreams, he boarded a bus to the capital for the first time, promising his family to return home better.

He completed his studies at the top of his class and looked forward to changing the world with his newly acquired knowledge and skills. However, a year after graduation, Shupavu was still jobless. The small online business he had started collapsed after the government moved to tax internet-based businesses. Back at home, his parents and siblings waited for him; the younger brother was about to join high school while his sister had dropped out for lack of fees. The whole family relied on him as his father was now old and frail and unable to provide for the family.

As hopelessness intensified, Shupavu stopped attending Mass as he dedicated more time to struggling to make a living for himself and the family. One day while strolling on the city streets, he met Ovu, a former university classmate, driving a flashy vehicle in the company of a young, beautiful lady. Life seemed to be going well for Ovu, who had dropped out of university due to gambling, and Shupavu could not believe that despite his academic excellence, he was still struggling. Ovu invited him to his office, where he introduced Shupavu to what he termed as online forex merchandising. This, however, turned out to be an illegal enterprise of conning people. Within a short time, Shupavu started making money and living large; spending time partying, drinking, and smoking. However, police raided the offices and arrested Shupavu and his team for engaging in cybercrime.

**S**hupavu's parents' first visit to the city was to witness his release from prison after a four-year jail term. He was emaciated, ragged, and withdrawn. He sought to reconnect with his Church back

home. He trained in agriculture and marketing through a church youth empowerment programme, and within a short time established a website to link livestock farmers with markets in the city. He became a youth mentor in his community.

## **JUDGE: SITUATION ANALYSIS**

Article 260 of the Constitution defines youth as persons aged between 18 and 35. Some 37 million Kenyans or 75 per cent of the country's approximated population of 47 million, according to the 2019 population census, are under the age of 35. This segment is expected to grow even further in the foreseeable future, up to approximately 80%, presenting Kenya with unique social and economic opportunities but equally enormous challenges such as mass unemployment.

In the political sphere, the youth constituted 39.7% of registered voters in 2022. The number of youth representatives holding elective positions had increased from 317 in 2017 to 335 in the 2022 general elections.

A July 2023 report by the Commission for Higher Education (CHE), noted that an average of 50,000 youths graduate annually from university. This excludes a greater number that go through other tertiary institutions, including technical and vocational training. These youth have a significant edge in technical expertise, knowledge, and skills. On the flip side, opportunities are limited even for university graduates, resulting in a significantly high youth unemployment rate. 67% of unemployed Kenyans are youth. Where employment is available, the youth face workplace discrimination, leading to mental distress and frustration.

The youth are trapped between high societal expectations and limited employment opportunities. This crisis has pushed many young people to drugs and substance abuse, alcoholism, crime (cybercrime and organised gangs), promiscuity and sexually transmitted infections, HIV/AIDS, cultism, extreme poverty, political exploitation, and family dysfunction. These challenges weigh heavily on the youth and dampen the immense potential they hold, as would be aided by high levels of innovation, youthful health and energy, great exposure, and the talents and education they possess.

The Kenya Youth Development Policy of 2019 recognises constitutional provisions under Article 55 that obliges the state to take measures, including affirmative action programmes, to ensure that the youth access relevant education and training and have opportunities to associate, be represented, and participate in political, social economic and other spheres of society.

At the individual level, youth should also be made more aware of their

great potential in shaping society through participation in democratic processes. As earlier demonstrated, although the youth form the majority of the Kenyan population, they lost an opportunity to bring on board youthful leadership that would best represent their interests by not registering as voters in large numbers. The youth allowed, all potential but without the moral safeguards of spirituality, can end up causing harm.

In all these, the important component of spirituality among youth should not be discarded. Pope Francis told the closing Mass for the 2019 World Youth Day in Panama City that: "You, dear young people, are not the future but the now of God."

## **SPIRITUAL REFLECTION**

In Moses, we learn how God waits on a person in this or that desert of their life and prepares His servant for the mission He has for them. He shows them the great potential they have inside that He wants to use.

Just as He saw in Moses, there is immense potential in our young people, and we often ignore the great prospects in ourselves. In the desert of our lives, at our lowest when we are empty, the Lord who created us and desires the best for us uplifts us. If we are humble before God, He will not only liberate us but also show us the untapped resource of virtue and goodness that He has placed inside us and then eventually send us on a mission as labourers in His vineyard. It takes this humility to see also the untapped potential in our youth.

Our lives, and those of our young people, have to be planted in the soil of the mercy of God. And this soil is the richest attainable for producing the virtues in our lives. Furthermore, we must allow ourselves to be pruned, among other things, of the prejudices that blind us to the untapped potential in young people. Though Jesus is the gardener of our lives, it's also fair to say that we are the gardeners as we must cooperate with our Lord, relying upon the supernatural resources of the Creator to ensure the healthy growth of our spiritual lives so that the good fruit of virtue may be born in our lives.

Even after being corrupted by sin, God the Father did not let us perish in our sinfulness. He sent our merciful Lord on a mission to till the soil

of our lives and to give us one more chance out of love. Our Lord works fervently to cultivate the soil around us. We must cooperate through daily prayer, fidelity to His commands, acts of loving sacrifice, and surrender to His providence. Ultimately, if we allow our Lord to do all He desires, our lives will bear good fruit.

- » Does the family support the youth spiritually?

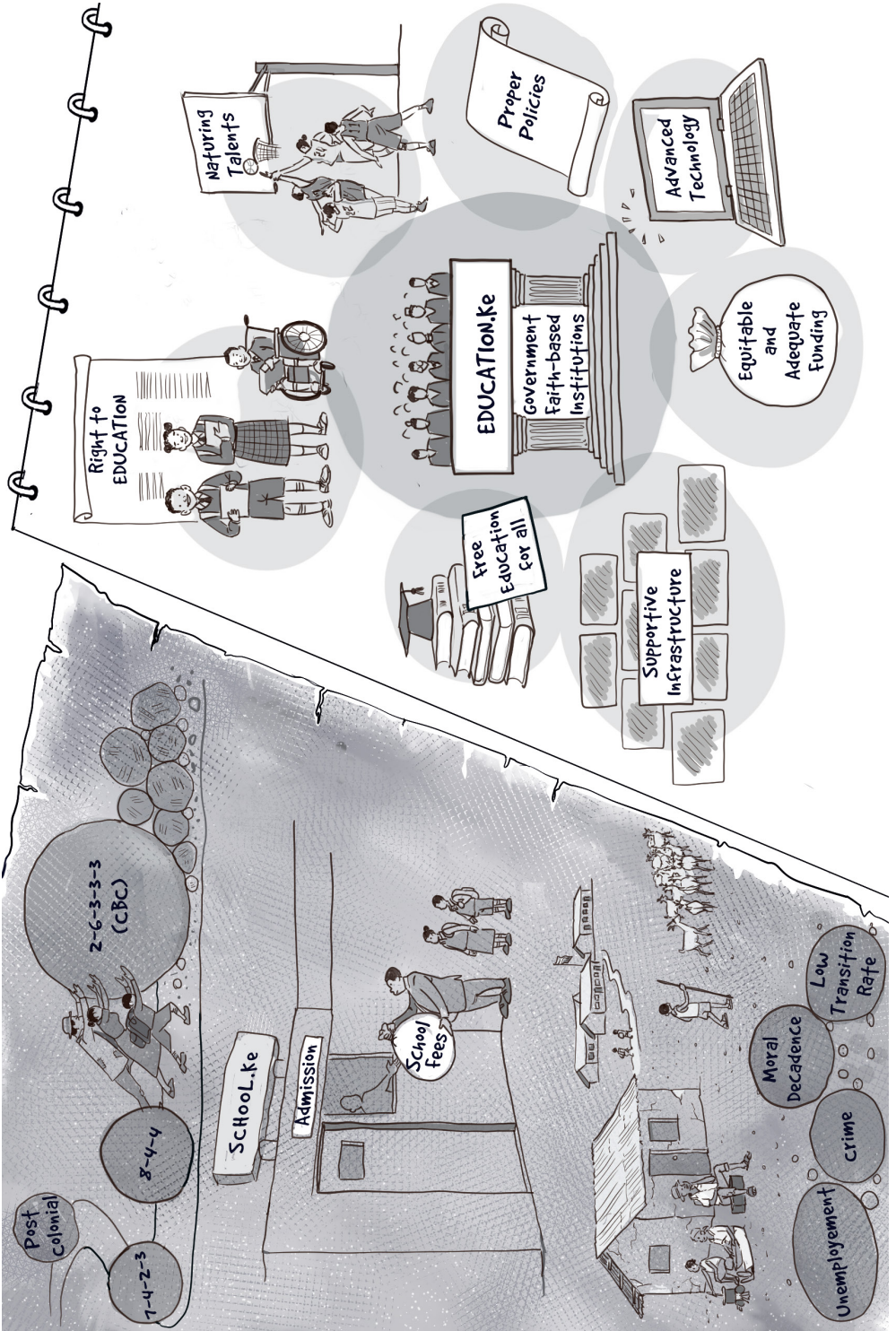

## WEEK FOUR

# THE ROLE OF HOLISTIC EDUCATION

### SEE: STORY

**R**ima lived in Elimu community, famous for its high performance in education, effective systems, and well-managed educational institutions. She was a lively child who loved playing tennis, studying, writing short stories, dancing, and singing. She was also a member of her community's Young Christian Union, where she played an active role as one of its officials.

Rima worked hard and was always on top of her class. She excelled in her primary school final year exams and joined a leading public secondary school. She grew to be an all-rounded individual in society, thanks to the support of her parents, teachers, religious leaders, and community.

She always aspired to become a pilot. Her tennis talent was nurtured, and she represented her community in several national and international tournaments. In the final year of her secondary education, the government introduced reforms in education, making it difficult for children from less privileged backgrounds to access tertiary education. Upon completing her secondary education, Rima was admitted to one of the best aviation training schools in the country but could not secure a loan from the post-secondary education fund. However, her proficiency in tennis secured a scholarship to further her education. Unfortunately, other students in Elimu community were not as lucky as Rima.

Religious leaders raised their concerns about the worsening situation in the country's education and convened a consultative meeting with all stakeholders. They agreed that everyone should fully execute their mandate. This was well received and adopted by the stakeholders, leading to the restoration of education standards nationally. There was improved performance and enrollment rate of learners in schools. The community has continued to produce notable, responsible leaders.

### JUDGE: SITUATION ANALYSIS

The Constitution, in Article 53.1b, recognises education as a basic right. The Education Act 2013 defines the rights of all persons to education regardless of their status.

At pre-independence, the education system was elitist, spearheaded by the colonial government to serve their interests. In the post-colonial

period, efforts were made to have inclusive education. The government attempted to improve education through initiatives like Harambee schools, which saw many areas establish community-based learning institutions. This led to an increased number of Kenyans accessing education as opposed to the pre-independence era. Since independence, major strides have been made to have the education system benefit all citizens. However, the challenge has been that many of the tried education systems have not fully served the country's needs. They have produced graduates who cannot cope with the changing industry trends, leading to mass unemployment.

The country has since independence implemented the 7-4-2-3 system (seven years of primary, four of secondary, two of high school and three of university education) from 1963 to 1984; the 8-4-4 (eight years of primary education, four each of secondary and university) from January 1985 to orient the youth towards self-employment, and now the competency based curriculum (CBC) launched in 2017. This nascent 2-6-3-3-3 system comprises two years of pre-primary education, six of primary, three each of junior and senior secondary, and three of university. CBC and the new university funding model are shrouded in uncertainty and confusion among parents, teachers, learners and other stakeholders due to unclear implementation structures by the government. This can be addressed through the inclusive involvement and participation of all stakeholders.

Faith-based institutions have played a significant role in providing education in the country since pre-independence. However, their role in education and policy formulation has lately been undermined, leading to moral decadence in educational institutions. With technological advancements, artificial intelligence (AI) is increasingly taking over education systems in the world. However, the country has yet to embrace such developments.

The Church has been vocal in promoting education worldwide. In February 2024, in a message to participants at a conference in Madrid, Spain, on the Church's commitment to education, Pope Francis highlighted the importance for Catholic institutions in ensuring that education is accessible to all. He reminded Spanish Catholic educators that the Church is called to promote an inclusive education, where all students can unleash their potential regardless of their background, recalling that this has always been an essential part of its educational mission. "Education is, above all, an act of hope in those before us (...), in their possibilities to change and contribute to the renewal of society," he said. "I cannot help but remember the many children and young people who do not have access to education in different parts of the world, who suffer oppression, and even war and violence."



## **SPIRITUAL REFLECTION**

**Joshua 5:9a, 10-12**

**2 Corinthians 5:17-21**

**Luke 15:1-3, 11-32**

On reaching the promised land, the Israelites stopped the nomadic life without any norms; they embraced a new life characterised by entry into a religious community guided by norms given by God. A true education leads us from a life without norms to a life guided by God's values. We become new creatures, letting go of our past way of life (2 Corinthians 5:17), letting go of our choices that were once led by our material cravings, and embracing new sets of choices determined by values inspired by God. These are the values of faith, hope, and love.

We often choose against this life, thus falling into sin. Our pride makes it hard to admit that we are sinners, leading us to self-justification. We are sinners who draw near to Jesus because we are spiritually hungry, just as the prodigal son was. We have a past full of regrets, just as the prodigal son. We are unsatisfied in life and are looking for a way out, just as this son of a loving father was. The story of the prodigal son from Jesus should fill us with hope that we, too, can share in the joy so generously bestowed upon this wayward son.

As you reflect on this Gospel passage and how the tax collectors and sinners felt as Jesus narrated the story of the prodigal son, you may have a certain fear and caution in approaching the Lord knowing your sinful situation but let the presence of Jesus fill you with hope. Try to understand what they must have thought and felt as they heard this story of the Father's abundant mercy. Think about how they would have related as they discovered that there was hope for them, too. See yourself, as one of those sinners who drew near to our Lord and you will be the cause of joy in the heart of the Father in Heaven.

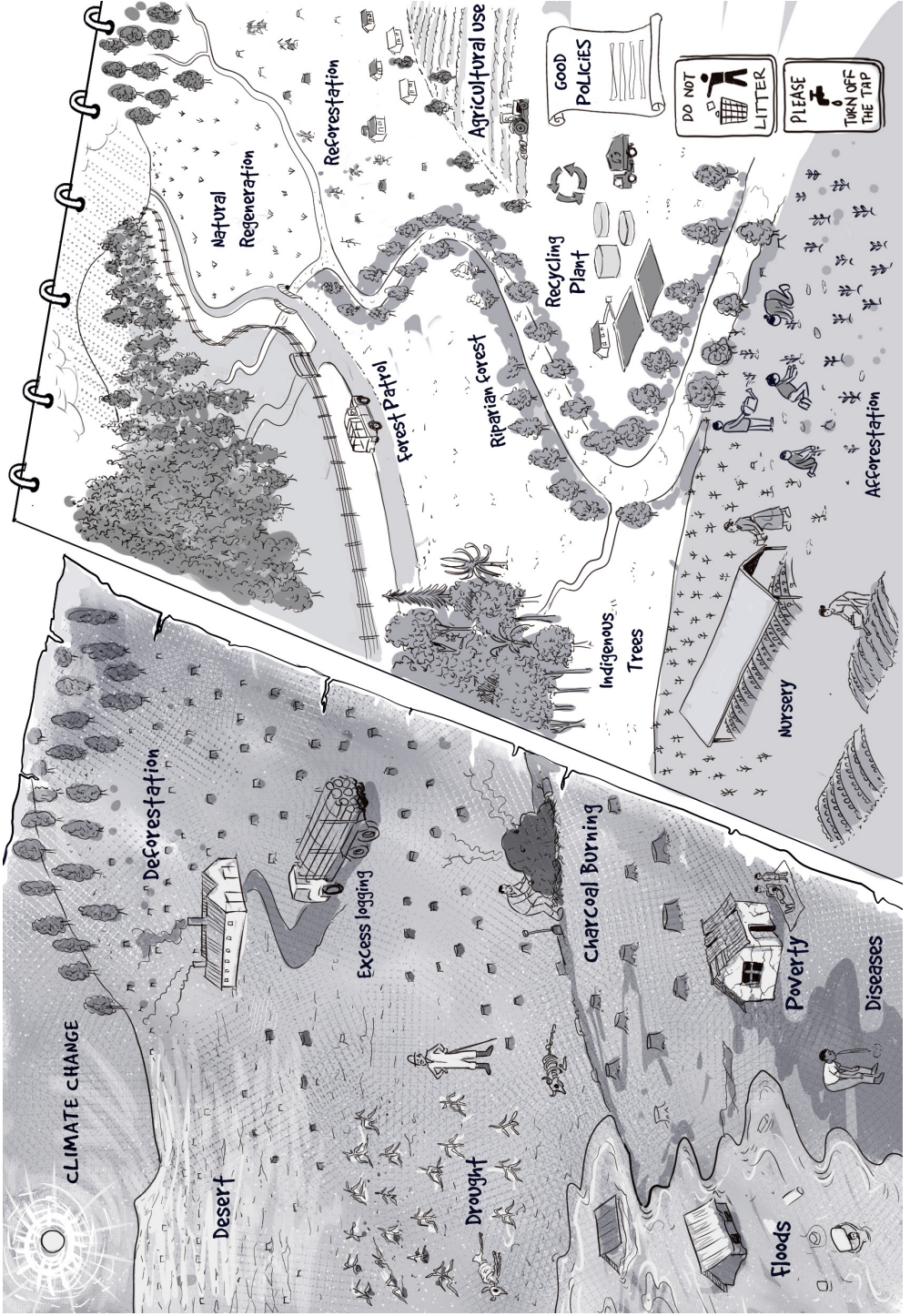

## WEEK FIVE

# CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME

### SEE: STORY

**E**vergreen village had an efficient ecosystem supported by a huge forest, providing a conducive climate and adequate rainfall. The villagers enjoyed fresh air, clean water, good vegetation, and different species of trees and animals. The village also provided water and other essential forest products and services to neighbouring villages.

Mjaraha owned a huge parcel of land, which he sold to a wealthy local merchant, Mzito, who set up a timber factory.

Having a ready market for timber and the need to gain from the business, the villagers started cutting down trees on their farms as a new source of income. After depleting their trees, they invaded the communal forest. As a result, rivers started drying up, animals migrated, the air was polluted by emissions from a local factory whose refuse contaminated the rivers and spread waterborne diseases. The once ever green village became systematically desolate.

Mazingira Poa, a local organisation operating in the adjacent village, intervened. They conducted public awareness forums on environmental degradation and best practices. The factory closed because the villagers no longer supplied logs. The environment slowly started improving and soon Evergreen village regained lost glory.

### JUDGE: SITUATION ANALYSIS

Kenya enjoys rich biodiversity and a unique tropical climate with varying weather patterns due to different physical features. The country enjoys fascinating environmental landscapes and diverse natural assets comprising animals, plants, minerals, and water. These are critical foundations for the country's sustainable development. The natural resources are key drivers of development policies, such as the Vision 2030.

Recognising the value of the environment and natural resources in the economic development of the country and the challenges these resources face, the government, in collaboration with local and international stakeholders, places environment and natural resources governance as a national priority. The country has developed relevant policies, enacted a range of legal frameworks, and established institutions to advance

the conservation of the environment and natural resources, such as the National Environment Management Authority (NEMA) which produces the State of the Environment report every two years since 2003.

The socio-economic well-being of Kenyans is intertwined with the environment, as it contributes directly and indirectly to the local and national economy through revenue generation and wealth creation in critical sectors like agriculture, fisheries, livestock, tourism, and trade. Despite the country's rich history of environmental and natural resources governance, several challenges have been witnessed (NEMA State of the Environment Report, 2019-2020). These include pollution, deforestation, water scarcity, flooding and soil erosion.

The country is also facing the increasing challenge of solid waste management, particularly the urban centres, characterised by many illegal dumpsites that form major sources of environmental pollution. Climate change is a threat to global, socio-economic development and environmental sustainability. This has led to frequent extreme weather events like prolonged droughts, unpredictable and irregular rainfall, flooding, and increased temperatures.

Pope Francis in his 2015 encyclical, *Laudato Si, on Care for our Common Home*, critiques consumerism and irresponsible economic development and laments environmental degradation and global warming, calling on all people to take swift and unified global action. *Laudato Si* is a call for action for individuals and societies to recognise the importance of care for our common home and work towards a more sustainable and just world for all living organisms.

## **SPIRITUAL REFLECTION**

**Isaiah 43:16-21**

**Philippians 3:8-14**

**John 8:1-11**

God's great things of the past should give us comfort that He will still do greater things in the present and the future ages. He makes a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert of our lives. Let us not dwell on the past but look forward to the work He does. He will always provide for his people even in the most difficult moments and places, bringing about a transformation that will be evident. God brings about new beginnings and blessings for His people.

In the second reading, St Paul tells us of the surpassing value of knowing Christ and the importance of pursuing a deep relationship with Him. We need to prioritise Christ above everything else knowing that we can



never be righteous without Him. We need to press on towards the goal of spiritual growth and maturity in Christ, letting go of past mistakes and achievements and focusing on the ultimate prize of eternal life with Christ. We must be consistent in our growth, persevering and striving toward becoming more like Christ.

Today's readings invite us to look at the present and the future being created by God. It is a present and a future that God desires for His people. It is a present that is for the good of all creation. We hope God will eventually restore the creation that we have destroyed by our bad choices to its original goodness.

This hope motivates us to work for a better environment. Our faith in God, who will eventually restore everything to the goodness that had been lost due to sin, inspires us to the care of the environment, seeking to undo the wrongs we have done due to our egoistic choices that led to the destruction of the environment.

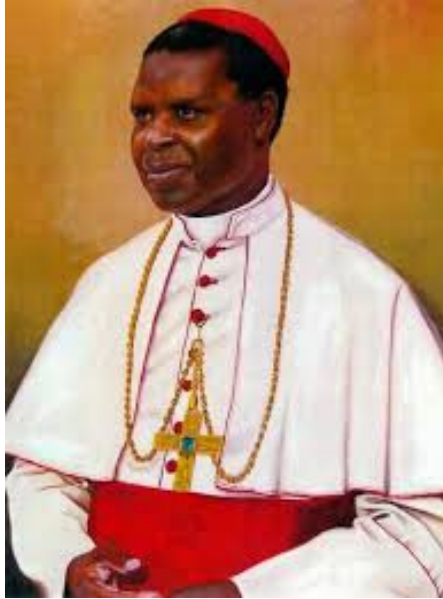
